Case 1. CSVP 2013-2760 (CP13020, ADDC NCYU, W.T. Lo, C.L. Chen, H.C. Kuo, D.Y. Lo)

Growing pigs, 13-week-old, showed clinical signs of abdominal breathing, nasal and mouth discharge increased. The morbidity was 40% (720/1800) and mortality was 5-10% (90-180/1,800).

Case 2. CSVP 2013-2761 (SAHII01 409, TACTRI, L.H. Chang, C.H. Yang)

Wistar rat, 12-week-old, female. This case was found during “the 28 subacute neonicotinoid insecticide toxicity experiment of Wistar Rat”. The rat showed clinical signs of convulsion, salivation and anorexia.

Case 3. CSVP 2013-2762 (CW13-026, NCHU, J.H. Yin, Y.T. Tien, F.T. Chan, J.W. Liao)

Formosan Pangolin, unknown age, female, with opened wound and fibula fracture caused by gin trap was found in the left hind leg. The patient was kept in an individual cage and the wound was under medical care for 3 months. Unfortunately, the pangolin presented anorexia and depression in clinic before death.

Case 4. CSVP 2013-2763 (CO13-0057-1, NCHU, Y.H. Lee, J.W. Liao)

Rabbit, female 7-year-old, presented with hematuria, was found with a firm bilateral tube-like mass in the abdomen. OHE was subsequently preformed.

Case 5. CSVP 2013-2764 (CP13-0802, ADDC, NCHU, J.H. Shien, H.H. Huang, W.F. Chang)

Chicken, 15-day-old, showed multiple organic hemorrhage. The mortality was 0.1% (30/30,000).

Case 6. CSVP 2013-2765 (CO13-859 F.X. Hou, W.C. Lee)

Growing pig, 12-week-old, showed depression, recumbence and sudden death in the recent one month. The morbidity was 20%. The mortality was 10%.

Case 7. CSVP 2013-2766 (CO13-829, IVP NCHU, G.W. Huang, C.H. Yang, C.C. Lin)

Canine, Formorsam Mountain, 6-year-old, spayed female. Panting, coughing, and vomiting had been found for half year. In the period, body weight loss (from 50kg to 33kg) was observed. Plenty of crushed bones in the dilated esophagus were observed at necropsy. (The gross view was shown as the following picture.)
